In our June issue, we included information on a survey for patients from the ADOCARE project team (ADOCARE is the consortium of Action for Teens aisbl and LUCAS - research centre of the KU Leuven, supported by the European Commission – Health and Consumers Directorate-General). guidelines for the European Commission. The survey deadline has been extended to the end of September 2014.
